 Miss Elsie Janis, the youngest of American stars, will make her first appearance in Lincoln, Wednesday, April 6, at the Oliver in "The Fair Co-Ed." This is the musical comedy by George Ade and Gustav Lueders in which Miss Janis has been appearing for almost two years, with long runs in Chicago and New York to her credit.
 "The Fair Co-Ed" was written by Mr. Ade for the dramatic society at his alma mater, Purdue University. Charles Dillingham witnessed the Purdue undergraduates' performance and was so well pleased with the piece that he secured the rights for it for Miss Janis. Then he engaged Gustav Lueders, of "The Prince of Pilsen" fame, to provide it with a musical setting. The result has been two years of substantial success for all.
 "The Fair Co-Ed" is in every way a worthy successor of "The College Widow." The scenes are laid at Bingham, the "freshwater" institution

 made famous in "The College Widow." Mr. Ade has preserved throughout the spirit of youth and wholesome enjoyment, and Mr. Lueders' music is in his best vein.
 Miss Janis is at the head of a company numbering 90, which includes practically the entire original cast, among them being Arthur Stanford, Edgar Halstead, James Reaney, Harry Depp, Gilbert Douglas, Sidney Jarvis, Inez Bauer, Althea Francis, Marion Mills and Elsie Stoele, and the college boy chorus of 40 young men.
 In place of her usual imitations, Miss Janis in the third act will demonstrate how Miss Anna Held might sing "The Cubanola Glide," how Eddie Foy might play Hamlet, how David Warfield might sing the "Yiddish Rag," how Bessie McCoy might do the hypnotic dance in "The Three Twins," and how George M. Cohan might play Romeo. She may also give an impersonation of Miss Ethel Barrymore in one of her well known plays.
