The events which will be run off today will be the same as that at a regular tracy meet, consisting of 100yard, 220-yard, 440-yard and 880-yard dashes; one and two-mile runs, shotput, hammer throw, discus throw, broad and high jump, pole vault, 120yard and 220-yard hurdles, and onehalf mile relay race. The contestants of the two teams may enter any event they wish, as this meet is for the one purpose only—to get a line on the material for track work.


