**A MEET TODAY TO GET  
A LINE ON TRACK MEN**

SQUAD DIVIDED INTO TWO SECTIONS TO COMPETE.

**REGULAR TRACK EVENTS LISTED**

Largest Track Squad in the History of the University Reports Every Day for Work on the Cinder Path.

An innovation in the work of the men who have been working on the track squad for the past weeks is to be tried today. The men of the squad have been working for the past weeks to get into form and Coach Cherrington is attempting to get a line on the men who have been out for work. For this reason Coach Cherrington has divided the men of the squad into two sections and these men have been placed in charge of Reed and Amberson.

This afternoon the men of the squad will meet at the state fair grounds and there a meet will be held to get a line on the men who have been working for the past few weeks and something will be determined as to what the men of the track squad can do.

**Sixty Men Out.**

At the present time there are more than sixty men out for work on the cinder path, and they have been training faithfully. Never before in the history of the university have so many men signified that they are anxious to make the team and perhaps win their letter. The chances to make the team for any of the men of the squad have never been better and the men have been making the best of their opportunities. The vacancies left in the team by the ineligibility of star men on the team last year leaves many events to be filled with men who are new at university track work, and the men of the university are taking every advantage that they have to make the team.

The events which will be run off today will be the same as that at a regular track meet, consisting of 100-yard, 220-yard, 440-yard and 880-yard dashes; one and two-mile runs, shot-put, hammer throw, discus throw, broad and high jump, pole vault, 120-yard and 220-yard hurdles, and one-half mile relay race. The contestants of the two teams may enter any event they wish, as this meet is for the one purpose only—to get a line on the material for track work.
