**INDIA MAKES ADVANCE ALONG WITH EUROPE**

W. T. ELMORE, RECENTLY RETURNED MISSIONARY, SPEAKS.

**NATIVE CUSTOMS ILLUSTRATED**

High Caste Indian Compares Favorably With People of Other Nations—Rites and Superstitions Pictured—Makes Appeal for Teachers.

Mr. W. T. Elmore, alumnus of the University of Nebraska, yesterday delivered a lecture at regular convocation on "India." Mr. Elmore recently returned from India, where he has been actively engaged in missionary work for ten years. His discussion was well illustrated by stereopticon views of photographs taken by him in this foreign country and was undoubtedly an excellent presentation of the manners, customs and costumes of that dark race. His lecture, in fact, was confined to a short description of each of the pictures thrown on the canvas, and was particularly instructive to all students of India and prospective missionaries.

Previous to discourse, Miss Joy, representative of the junior class, rendered two vocal solos.

**Advance of People.**  
One of the most remarkable facts given significance by Mr. Elmore is the consistent advance of the India people with the peoples of other European countries. He closely discriminated between the "old" and "new" India, and by portraying the dress and customs of the inhabitants of the "new" division, he made a favorable comparison between the high caste of this people with the same of other foreign tribes.

Among some of the notable representations which the speaker gave were pictures of his foreign home, the manner of living, the schools instituted for the natives, including the class of teachers, students and instruction, the native practices such as the traditional custom of initiating youth into manhood, the performing of rites to ward off superstitious evils and idolatry.

In conclusion Mr. Elmore made an appeal to the girls of Nebraska to go to India and diffuse some of their acquired knowledge among this illiterate and semi-barbarous people by becoming not only teachers but principals of the English schools. He ascribed the cause of the phenomenal progress of the Indian people to the efforts made by educated missionaries toward this goal, and declared his intention of resuming his work as an exponent and representative of the University of Nebraska.
