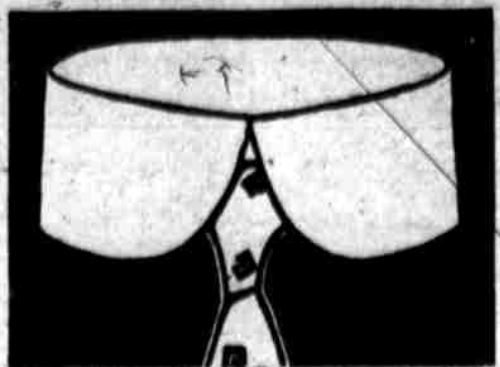

STATE CHAMPIONSHIP POSSIBLY NEXT WEEK

DEBATE WILL NOT BE HELD IN LINCOLN.

NINE DISTRICTS WILL COMPETE

Last Debate Was Held Friday at Wahoo, Plattsmouth Winning. First Defeat in History of Wahoo Debating.

The state high school championship debate is to be held next week if possible. The debate will of course be held outside of Lincoln. Professor Fogg, president of the league, is busy with the arrangements and may be able to announce definitely the meeting place in a day or two. The place must be able to accommodate the audience in good shape and be where good railroad connections can be made.

The debate will be between the representatives of the schools who have won the championships of their respective districts. They are Geneva in the central district, Ashland in the eastern, Hastings in the southern, Kearney in the western, Beaver City in the southwestern, Broken Bow in the west central, Alliance in the northwestern, Valentine in the northern and Plattsmouth in the east central.

The last of the district debates was held last Friday night at Wahoo, where Plattsmouth won the decision over Wahoo. Plattsmouth had the affirmative of the league question, "Resolved, that labor unions are on the whole beneficial." The judges were Prof. H. W. Caldwell, Prof. Edwin Maxey and Albert Watkins. The judges report a very excellent debate, Professor Caldwell saying that it was one of the very best high school debates he had ever heard. Judge Good of Wahoo presided. Plattsmouth has appointed Miss Marie Douglass as its representative in the state debate. This is Wahoo's first defeat in three years, that town having won the championship each preceding year of the league's history.

PAN-HEL LAST NIGHT.

Finest Informal Dance of Year Held at the Armory.

Last evening the annual Pan-Hellenic dance was held at the armory. This was one of the finest informal dances of the university social season. About one hundred and twenty couples were in attendance. Walt's orchestra of ten pieces furnished the music.

A little to the east of the door between the chapel and the armory the orchestra was stationed on a platform and were screened off with palms.
