**CORNHUSKERS LOSE FINAL BALL GAME**

MANY ERRORS LARGELY RESPONSIBLE FOR RESULT.

TWO HOME RUNS MADE BY AGGIES

Metcalf Makes Dazzling Double Play—Varsity Could Not Hit in the Pinches—Made More Safe Hits.

The inability to hit in the pinches and a large number of errors on the part of the Cornhuskers enabled the Kansas Aggies to defeat the varsity by the score of 8 to 2 in yesterday's game. The Nebraska team made a larger number of hits than their opponents, but on several occasions when there were two or three men on bases, the Aggie pitcher would tighten up and the Cornhuskers would fail to score.

The luck seemed to be all with the Kansans. Time and time again when it seemed inevitable that the local men would score some turn of luck would favor the Jayhawkers and the Nebraskans would die on the bases.

Two home runs were made by the visitors. Both of them soared over the right field fence. This is the first time this year that more than one home run has been made in one game.

**Double by Metcalfe.**  
The feature of the game was a clever double play by Ole Metcalfe. With one man on first, the clever Cornhusker short stop nabbed a hot grounder, ran and touched second base and then threw out the runner at first. It was one of the best plays seen on Nebraska field this year.

Watters, the regular Nebraska second sacker, was out of the city yesterday and Fehliman played second. Lofgren played in right field and proved to be a dependable hitter.
