The evening classes meet three evenings each week—Monday, Wednesday and Friday. The instruction is given by teachers of long experience and recognized ability.

B., speaking from his own experience, says: "I have no hesitation in saying that I believe the freshman in college makes a mistake if he does not avail himself of the opportunity of studying shorthand and typewriting. The student who has a knowledge of shorthand has not only a very rapid means of taking notes from class work to be used

later as references in preparation for reviews and examinations, but also has a knowledge which may be readily turned into money during his spare hours and vacations. Moreover, such student, when his college course is finished, is assured immediate employment in the commercial world."
