The Rag is owned by a corporation of which the regents own a controlling interest. The other shares are owned by two tlumni of Nebraska.

Over Two Years. The Nebraskan has been run at the present size for a little over two years, the present semester being the fifth semester of the paper being issued as a five-column sheet. If the Daily is to be decreased in size it will be made to the former four-column paper which it was before the surplus was accumulated by the business department.
