Sale of Tickets Limited—Dances to Be  
Called—Nothing Will Admit  
People but Tickets.

Governor Ashton C. Shallenberger and Mrs. Shallenberger and Captain Halsey E. Yates and Mrs. Yates will be the guests of honor at the coming sophomore hop. Chairman Andrews announced last evening that the governor and Captain Yates had accepted the invitation to be patrons of the annual sophomore function. The dance will be held at the Lincoln on November 18. The committee is making arrangements to hold one of the best informals ever given by a university class. Members of the committee were receiving congratulations last night from classmen who learned of their success in securing the governor and the commandant as official chaperones.

### Governor Accepts.

Governor Shallenberger returned to Lincoln on Tuesday after a speech-making trip out through the state. Early Wednesday morning he was called upon by Chairman Andrews, who delivered the invitation from the sophomore class committee. The governor accepted without hesitation, saying that he would be very glad to attend and that he felt that he was really honored by the invitation. Captain Yates said that he would be glad to accept the invitation.

### Tickets Limited.

Only one hundred tickets are for sale. Some persons may be offended if they are not able to get in at the last moment, but the announcement is to the effect that only tickets will be

good at the door. The tickets are going rapidly, considering the length of time before the dance. If the one hundred are sold before the day of the dance absolutely no cash will be accepted at the door.

Boys will call the dances in the parlors, so that there will be no chance for the dancers to lose track of the program. Wait's seven-piece orchestra will furnish the music. Several members of the Aero club of Cornell university are building an aeroplane at Ithaca.

Fall training for crew candidates has begun at Pennsylvania. The squad is the largest in Pennsylvania crew history.

A committee on non-athletic organization at Michigan has charge of all dates for entertainments. This does away with conflicting engagements.

Columbia university has the largest enrollment of any college or university in America, 7,058 being the number enrolled.

At the University of Missouri is a class which spends nearly an hour a day discussing motives for buying things to eat.

As a result of a gift by Andrew Carnegie, Yale recently dedicated a new swimming pool which cost \$70,000. The pool holds 160,000 gallons of water.

The observatory at Michigan is rapidly becoming one of the best equipped astronomical stations in the country. A new 37½ in reflecting telescope will be in use in a few weeks.

Staff members of the college paper at the University of Utah and those students who participate in any dramatic productions given by the student body are awarded the official gold monogram.
