MORE SPECIMENS.

Botany Department Receives a Valuable Collection.

Again, the botany department has received a valuable addition to its collection of specimens. This time the addition consists of nine hundred species of plants from the Holy Land. Three of the nine boxes have arrived. The other six boxes have been shipped and will reach Lincoln in a few days. Palestine is noted for its great variety of shrubs and small plants, and this collection is considered as a valuable one.

The specimens were collected by the American colony at Jerusalem under the direction of Mr. John E. Dinsmore, a member of the colony. The nine boxes were shipped by mail at a cost of nearly five dollars per box.

Dinsmore offered the collection to Dr. Bessey some time ago and the purchase was made without hesitation.
