It is highly probable seven Cornhuskers who won their letters this year will not be back in the game next year. Four graduate and three have played their three allotted years on the varsity and will have to step out and make room for some of the younger aspirants.

Those who will graduate are: Chauner, Shonka, Sturmer and Elliott. Those who have served their three years are: Temple, Collins and Minor. Chauner has been playing a star game at end for the past two years and his loss will be felt. Shonka is one of the most powerful men Nebraska has ever had on the line. Last year he played center and this year tackle. Sturmer has been awarded his letter this year for the first time. For three years he has faithfully stuck with the squad and his perseverence has been rewarded. He played guard in several of the varsity games this season. Elliott is another guard who has two "N's" to

his credit and who has been one of the foundation stones of Nebraska's

stone wall. Captain Temple, Collins and Minor are the only ones who retire on account of the three year limit. Temple has been more than holding his own at tackle, and has carried the ball for as great gains as any other man on the line. Temple hits hard and is hard to stop. Collins is one of the most adaptable men on the line. As center he has probably more to learn under the new rules than any other man on the team, and he has made good with a vengeance. Minor is the only backfield man who will retire. For three years he has played halfback and end and he has never failed

to come up to the standard.
