THE HONOR SYSTEM.

The discussion of the honor system at convocation Thursday provided material for sober thought on the part of a large majority of the members of the student body of the University of Nebraska. While the honor system at the present time is not a new thing in this institution or other schools of equal standing, yet the students of the University of Nebraska must come to the realization sooner or later that this matter must be taken up and dealt with, and finally adopted.

As Professor Fling stated, the matter is not so much the system as it is a matter of personal honor. That the standards set by students in this

school as well as neighboring schools is lower than the best standards of the outside world is deplorable. The matter should be remedied at once. Honor is at the poorest, a thing which cannot be valued in dollars and cents. It must be taken as the test of a man's character, and by means of which the men of the world are measured. That the low standard on which honor rests has its effect both in the University and on society, as well as business, cannot be doubted, and the remedy is found in the student body.

"Am I my brother's keeper," as explained by Dean Bessey, is another matter for sober consideration. Therefore, we should look at the matter on all sides and take the problem in hand and deal with it as men and women and not students. That the movement must come from the students was explained by Professor Fling, and therefore it depends upon the whole student body to support the ideas which have been advanced by representatives of the faculty.

Who will be the first to push the movement? Are you in favor of it? The fraternities of the University have a working system of their own.
