Although the score was virtually a tie at the close of the first half, it was apparent that the opposition to the locals was weakening, and at the finish of the game Nebras-

ka had acquired a lead of ten points. The Nebraska boys certainly played in good form in the Saturday game. It was evident from the time that the whistle first sounded that the locals were going to retrieve their right to the championship over Kansas, which they nominally lost in the even break on the Lawrence floor two weeks ago. They manifested the direct results of weeks of rigorous training and defined coaching which has been their lot the past few weeks. In fact, it was

generally declared that if the all-year-round coach basis had been established a year ago, the prospects for Nebraska basketball championship would have been strongly affirmative. "Skinny" Hiltner showed a remarkable prowess in breaking up the formation plays, "Jimmy" Gibson excelled in finding the baskets at forward, probably playing even more consistently than did Frank, although Frank was an indisputable co-worker in locating the ring for goals.
