#### COURSE IN SOCIOLOGY.

#### Students Under Dr. Eaves Looking Into Lincoln Questions.

A beneficial and instructive course in advanced sociology is being given this semester by Dr. Eaves. The class, consisting of six or eight students, is doing active work in the investigation of several conditions in Lincoln. Up to the present time the class has dealt with the four questions of infant mortality, condition of the Lincoln boys, trachoma, and a comparison of the Lincoln health department with that of other cities. The result of the investigations on the subject of infant

mortality have been published and that on trachoma will soon appear in print.

The course has the double benefit of instructing those taking it on actual social work and in placing before the public at large valuable information on public questions.

#### Rev. Hayes Delivers First of a Series of Lectures Before Association.

Rev. S. Mills Hayes, pastor of the Holy Trinity Episcopal church, gave a short address yesterday at 11 o'clock to the members of the Y. W. C. A. in the association rooms in the Temple.
