At the regular meeting of the interfraternity athletic board, held Tuesday morning, the schedule for the annual interfrat baseball tournament was officially announced. Baseball has recently become one of the most popular methods for the fraternities to exercise their wealth of rivalry, this year being especially significant. A few of the fraternities have already "established training camps" and become frequenters of the university athletic fields. The teams competing in the first round have again been designated in alphabetical tabulation, there being two divisions in order that the winners of the respective sides might contend for the championship, a little on the order of the "world series"only different.
