BASEBALL SCHEDULE COMPLETE

THE INTERFRATERNITY ATHLETIC BOARD ARRANGES FOR SERIES OF GAMES.

At the regular meeting of the interfraternity athletic board, held Tuesday morning, the schedule for the annual interfrat baseball tournament was officially announced. Baseball has recently become one of the most popular methods for the fraternities to exercise their wealth of rivalry, this year being especially significant. A few of the fraternities have already "established training camps" and become frequenters of the university athletic fields. The teams competing in the first round have again been designated in alphabetical tabulation, there being two divisions in order that the winners of the respective sides might contend for the championship, a little on the order of the "world series"—only different.

In the first district Alpha Theta Chi will meet Beta Theta Pi April 4; Alpha Tau Omega, May 13; Delta Tau Delta, May 5; Delta Upsilon, April 24, and Kappa Sigma, May 1.

Beta Theta Pi will contest with Alpha Tau Omega April 26; Delta Tau Delta, April 10; Delta Upsilon, May 3, and Kappa Sigma, May 11.

Alpha Tau Omega plays Delta Tau Delta May 16; Delta Upsilon, April 8, and Kappa Sigma, April 21.

Delta Tau Delta contests with Delta Upsilon April 28, and Kappa Sigma, April 6. Delta Upsilon will meet Kappa Sigma May 8.

In the second division Sigma Nu will play Phi Kappa Psi April 7; Sigma Alpha Epsilon, May 15; Sigma Chi, May 6; Phi Gamma Delta, April 27; and Phi Delta Theta, April 22.

Phi Kappa Psi will meet Sigma Alpha Epsilon April 25; Sigma Chi, April 29; Phi Gamma Delta, May 4, and Phi Delta Theta, May 9.

Sigma Alpha Epsilon will contest with Sigma Chi April 3; Phi Gamma Delta, May 17; and Phi Delta Theta, May 2.

Sigma Chi will meet Phi Gamma Delta April 11; and Phi Delta Theta, May 12. Phi Gamma Delta and Phi Delta Theta will play April 5.

possible to obtain information. Some statistics are given which show that the class is represented in twenty-four states and two foreign countries, Mrs. William Axling (Lucinda W. Burrows) being engaged in missionary work in Japan with her husband, and Miss Winifred Hyde studying in Jena, Germany, for her Ph. D. degree.

Fifty-eight members of the class remain in Nebraska, while Washington is next with seven. Seventy-six are married, thirty-four being listed as housewives. The teacher's profession is represented by twenty, ten are doctors, nine are lawyers, three are farmers, two are engaged in the government service, three are doing graduate work and three are "at home."
