The University of Chicago has accepted the invitation of the bureau of insular affairs of the war department to send to the department of education in the Philippine Islands two lecturers for the summer assembly of teachers at Baguio, the summer capital of the Philippines. Associate Professor J. Paul Goode of the department of geography and Associate Professor Francis Wayland Shepardson of the department of history will leave Chicago this month to lecture before this assembly.

An agreement for two years of debates between the sophomores of the University of Chicago and the University of Michigan has been drawn up by C. F.
