

STUDENTS CHOICE OF A LIFE WORK DISCUSSED

MANY HAVE NOT YET MADE THEIR DECISION.

SOME VERY IMPORTANT TOPICS

Successful Men in Their Professions Will Make Addresses at Mid-week Meetings.

One thing of vital importance in the life of a student is the choice of a life work. Some men decide this even before they enter the high school—more have decided when they enter the university, but there still remain a large number who have yet to choose their vocation. The committee on meetings of the Association has outlined a series of life work meetings, which shall be held at the regular mid-week meeting period.

The following are some of the topics to be presented: The Opportunities of a Christian Lawyer, Teaching as a Life Work, The Ministry and the Strong Man, Medical Ethics, Opportunities of a Christian Business Man, Secretaryship as a Life Work. THE STUDENT WORLD.

Georgia School of Technology reports 275 Association members, 290 enrolled in Bible study, and 36 men studying negro life in the south. One interesting feature of the Bible study is the fact that each of the ten fraternities has a Bible class in its hall. General Secretary E. A. Turner teaches six of these classes.

The annual banquet of the University of West Virginia was a signal success this year. There were 125 men present. Among those who spoke were State Secretary Rice, President D. B. Purinton, Coach Lender and At-

torney Stewart. Judge Frank Cox was toastmaster. This banquet was followed by a three-day financial campaign, during which about \$700 was subscribed.

At the University of Kansas, seven fraternities, representing 170 men have arranged for a course of lectures on the Bible, and 200 other men are enrolled in systematic Bible study.

The classes for teaching English to foreigners of the Christian Association at Lehigh university have met again this year and a very successful work is being carried on.

Thirty college men from the institutions in southern California are to be out on evangelistic work during the Christmas holidays, touching four very needy centers in the organized counties in this section—Sanger, Oxnard, Anaheim and Chino.

Dr. Hall, dean of the Northwestern university medical school, spent October 23-30 among the colleges of Kansas delivering his lectures to men.

In a combined Bible study institute and evangelistic campaign at Tuskegee Normal and Industrial Institute, conducted by W. D. Weatherford, W. A. Hunton and J. B. Watson, 269 men made an open declaration of their decision to live a Christian life, and on the closing night 710 men enrolled in Bible study. This number will be increased during the week to 850 or more. The women will likely also have 300 in Bible study.

LINCOLN HIGH PRESENTS PLAY.
