GREATLY INTERESTED IN Y. M. C. A. WORK IN JAPAN AND OTHER LANDS.

A. will probably convene in Tokyo in the same year. While Mr. Yamashita is on government business, he is also vitally interested in the work of the Japanese Young Men's Christian association. Colton of the international committee and Arthur Jorgenson, who will soon sail from Wisconsin to Tokio to take up association work there. Mr. Yamashita will probably attend the Estes Park conference in June.

**NEGRO LIFE IN THE SOUTH**

DR. WEATHERFORD WRITES INTERESTING BOOK ON THE BLACK MAN.

Students will remember with lively interest Dr. Weatherford and his address last winter. He is a southern man and is a graduate of Vanderbilt university. Students of North America are under obligations to him for the production of this book. He has confined himself to big central issues, and on these he has spoken with intelligence, judicial spirit and deep conviction. The treatment of the book is utterly without bias.

The author believes in the negro and his possibilities. He regards him as a man who is down, nevertheless is a man, and one who should be treated as a man. The book is written from this standpoint. The inevitable conclusion from the facts presented is that the negro never has had his rights in this land of boasted equality, and that the considerations of justice, emphasized by previous neglect, and humanitarianism and also of self-interest, demand that college men understand the problem and give themselves unselfishly to its solution. The important topics taken up are "Why Study the Negro Question," "The Economic Condition of the Negro," "The Health and Housing of the Negro," "The Education of the Negro," "The Religion of the Negro," and "What Can We Do?"
