Demand Return of Culprits Participating in Dormitory Raid.
 Instruction was suspended at the Washington state college yesterday as the result of a strike of students. At a meeting last night it was decided that all of the 1,200 students should remain away from classes until the culprits who participated in a raid on the girls' dormitory early Tuesday morning were apprehended and expelled. Pickets were stationed at all entrances to the buildings to prevent any one entering the class rooms.
