AESTHETIC IN ENGINEERING.

Prof. L. A. Scipio Tells Society of Its Great Importance.

Prof. L. A. Scipio addressed the engineering society on "The Aesthetic in Engineering Details." In his introduction he said it was a very much neglected subject and that there are very few text books which treat it. The subject deals with the art in designing and as styles change we can determine the stage of civilization by the beauty and types of the details of its constructions. It takes time and study to appreciate the beauty of a construction. Considerable criticism is made of engineers upon the appearance of their work. An engineer does not think so much in the designing of the appearance as he does of the strength. The principles underlying the work of the artist and the engineer are reversed.
