**SOME REGISTRATION FIGURES.**

Nebraska Shows Up Well Among the Larger Universities.

Statistics compiled by the Minnesota alumni weekly from registration figures at the leading universities show an astonishing growth not only in the west, but in the far east. Columbia leads the list with a total of more than 9,000 students, while Nebraska with better than 4,600 is eleventh. The figures are totals including all registrations, less the duplicates. They are as follows:
