much higher, and more conveniently arranged. This will be held as a reserved seat section.

Two hundred seats in this stand are to be divided off from the remainder and held in reserve especially for co-eds who come unescorted to the games. Efforts are being made to interest the co-eds in some such decorative schemes as have been pulled off at former games, and from the prospects it would seem that the girls will play no minor part in Cornhusker rooting this year.

Special Arrangements for Co-Eds.

Manager Eager has consented to sell reserved seats in this section at the same price as the general admission season students' tickets, \$3.00.

To the east and west of the new central grandstands, the old stands will be added, making a solid bank of stands along the entire north side of the field. On the south, the huge bleachers, in use for the past two years will be utilized, and before the Michigan game, others will be added to the eastward, increasing the seating capacity of the field stands to nearly seven thousand.
