Helen Lawrence, ex 1913, of Fremont, is visiting at the Alpha Phi house.

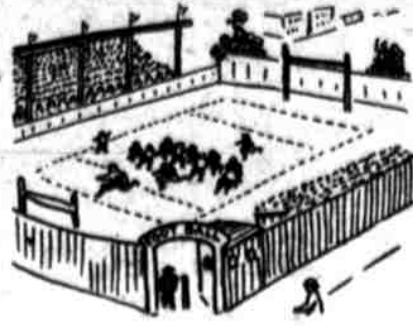
