Miss Lute to Berkeley.

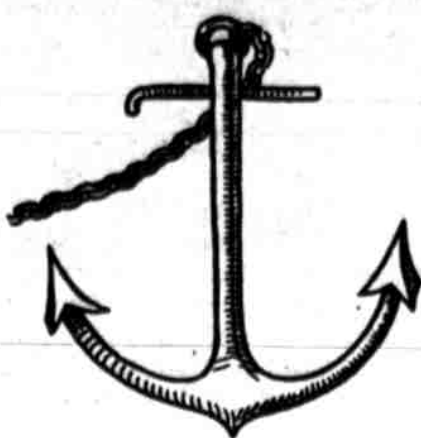
