LEAVE FOR NATIONAL DAIRY SHOW—WILL VISIT OMAHA PLANTS.

The dairy stock-judging team was selected yesterday and will start for the National Dairy Show in Chicago tomorrow. The men who made the team in the final tryouts are Kenneth Warner, R. H. Camp, A. H. Beckhoff, W. J. Rupert. Only three men will enter the contest on October 27, but the final selection will be made on the last day before the contest, the fourth man acting as alternate.

Will Visit Many.

Before going to Chicago, the squad will visit and do some practice judging at the principal dairies at Omaha, Milwaukee, Waukesha and Madison, Wisconsin, where they will also visit the University of Wisconsin.

In the judging contest next Friday the Nebraska team will compete with teams from twenty other leading agricultural colleges of the United States. Besides the team championship, there are other valuable trophies. Each of three breeder's associations offers a \$450 scholarship to the man who makes the highest individual score on that particular breed.
