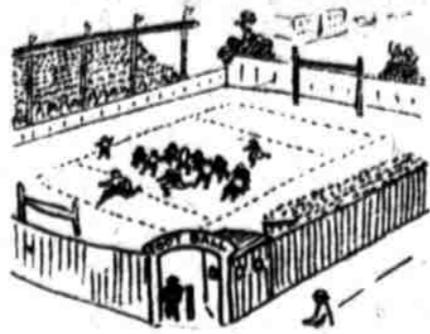
Nearly one thousand students and alumni attended and gave vent to their school spirit through numerous songs and yells.
