

KANSAS TO PUBLISH DAILY

THE DAILY KANSAN TO CHANGE HANDS AND BECOME FIRST-CLASS.

The installation of a department of journalism in the University of Kansas has inspired the editor of the Daily Kansan with the idea of improving the college paper at that institution.

A campaign has been launched to make the "Kansan" a daily paper, as are most of the publications of surrounding schools. Five hundred more subscribers are wanted, and if secured, the Kansas paper will become a daily after January 1.

Board Resigns.

The present board agrees to relinquish its profits in the publication, and it further proposes to have its accounts audited by a faculty committee. The management of the paper is to be given entirely to the students, who are to obtain their position on a merit basis.

The present cost of the paper is \$3,000 a year, and it is proposed to increase the size, print more features, send out more copies—which will bring the cost up to \$6,000.
