NEEDY STUDENTS AIDED PURPOSE OF LOAN FUND

extraordinary cases, shall not exceed \$100 per semester. For each loan a note shall be taken, drawn for the full amount of the loan and with interest at 5 per cent per annum, payable as specified in the note. The maximum time limit for which notes shall be drawn shall be two years from the first day of the month following the probable date of graduation. The committee will expect the maker of the note to furnish additional security; either an endorser or acceptable collateral.

9. The amount of each loan shall be held as a deposit with the treasurer of the fund in favor of the principal maker of the note, and shall be subject to withdrawal by him in sums not exceeding twenty-five (\$25.00) per month, except at the close of the senior year, or if a graduate student, at the end of the course. The committee reserves the right to modify this rule in extraordinary cases.

10. The committee may at any time require from the beneficiary a statement of his expenses while at the University.

11. The committee may, even after

an application has been granted and before the full sum of the loan has been drawn by the student, cancel the portion remaining on deposit and require a new note for the part drawn at the time of cancellation.

12. No distinctions shall be made among students on account of sex or course of study further than those prescribed by the donors.

13. The rules governing the loaning of money to students may be altered at any time by a vote of the majority of the committee or may be suspended for any specific case when, in the judgment of the Chancellor or the committee such change shall seem necessary for better accomplishing the purpose of the donors.
