"I have always contended that what football spectators like to see is the ball moved down the field by a series of well-executed plays, cleverly designed and operated. The basketbalk feature in which the ball is thrown all over the field and passes back and, forth from one team to another is certainly not good football.

"I would like to see a return to some of the principles of the old game."
