

**CHANCELLOR AVERY  
INVESTIGATES TYPHOID**

REPORTS ON RECENT EPIDEMIC  
AMONG STUDENTS.

**"MORE SCARED THAN HURT"**

Comparatively Few Cases of Real  
Typhoid, But Most of Illness of  
a Minor Nature.

Chancellor Avery has made a complete and thorough investigation of the typhoid situation in the University of Nebraska, which he completed Thursday, and reports the following results:

There are indeed many cases of typhoid fever among students who are attending the University. But by far the greater majority of the students who are now ill are suffering from pneumonia, la grippe, or very severe colds. They have not typhoid, nor are they likely to have it, but are ill through their own negligence in taking care of themselves.

The following is a communication from the Chancellor's office in respect to the illness up to date:

"The following is a complete list to date of all University students that are reported to have been stricken with typhoid. It includes all the names published in the list of January 12:

"Herbert Diamond, a student in the Lincoln Academy, died of typhoid. The Lincoln Academy is not a part of the University.

"In the case of the first four named the illness did not develop into ty-

phoid. It is not known whether later symptoms have failed to confirm the typhoid diagnosis in other cases, but presumably some of them have not developed the genuine disease. Students, professors, and physicians are especially requested to look over the list and report to the Chancellor's office any of these instances, and also omissions, of which there are undoubtedly some. Most of the additions since the list of January 12 was given to the public have been cases where the patient was stricken some time ago, but where the report was held back by the physician pending confirmation.

"Gus Lindberg, an assistant at the State Farm, is the only employe of the institution known to have the disease.

"The list includes students at the University Farm. It shows that about one per cent of all the students in residence are ill."
