

ELEVEN FIRMS BIDDING ON NEW LAW BUILDING

CONTRACT FOR ERECTION OF STRUCTURE MAY BE LET THIS MORNING.

Eleven firms are bidding for the contract for the erection of the new law building on the state university campus. The contract will probably be awarded at the meeting of the board of regents Thursday morning.

Among the contractors out for the job is George A. Shawl of Seneca, Kas., who was the successful bidder on the contract for the new plant industry building at the state farm, awarded at the last meeting of the board. The figure of the contract will be well within the \$85,000 appropriation of the legislature, as all extras must also come out of the latter. The board will also adopt architects' plans for the new medical building at Omaha and advertise for bids upon them.

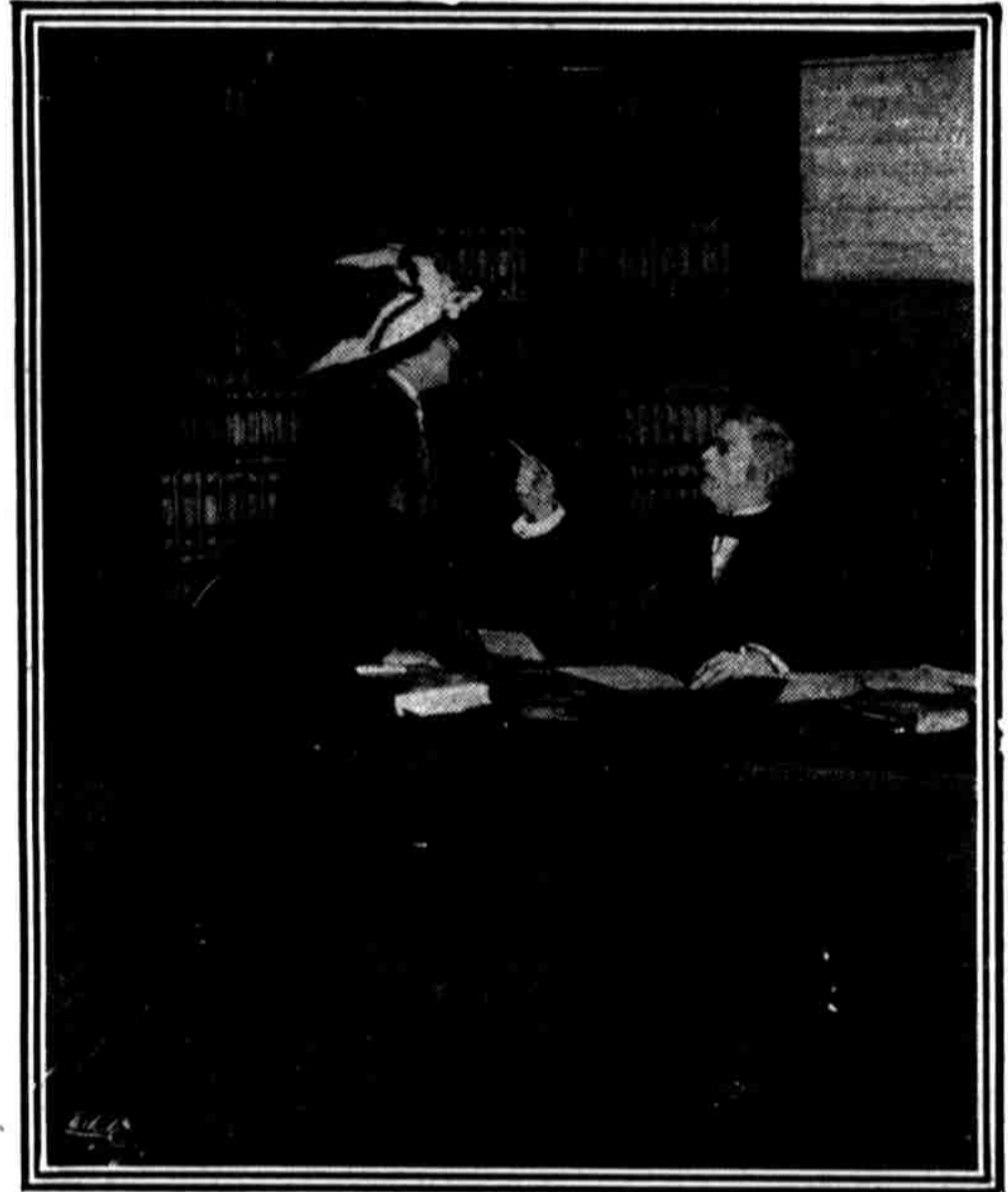
