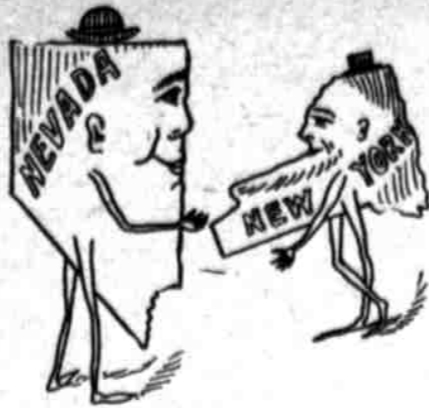
There was no meeting of the Palladian Literary Society Friday night. The girls of the society were entertained by Miss Stuff at her home.
