The Nebraska Civic League is a new organization in the University. It is composed of men who are most deeply interested in public problems of local and national interest. There are at the present only ten members, but all of these men are experienced speakers, and most of them have appeared before the school as such. They will give a series of speeches of ten minutes length at different times before different audiences. The first one of these will be given in the First Christian church next Sunday, when seven of the members will deliver short addresses on a discussion of the liquor problem. Different methods of dealing with it from both sides of the question will be presented. They will not all take the prohibition side of the question, but there will be much said for the traffic that has received such universal condemnation.

Three prizes are being offered for first place, graded on thought, composition and delivery. The first will be a \$25 prize, second \$15, and third \$10. These prizes are being offered by Mrs. F. M. Hall of Lincoln, who takes an enthusiastic interest in all University affairs. The opening address will be delivered by ex-Mayor Love, the chairman of the meeting to be Representative Selleck.
