GRAHAM TAYLOR TO ADDRESS STUDENTS AT CONVOCA-TION MONDAY.

As part of the local Men and Religion Forward Movement, a special convocation will be held for University students in the Temple theatre. Monday at 11:00 o'clock. Graham Taylor of Chicago will address the University public on the "Social Obligations of Educated Men and Women."

Graham Taylor is one of the very great authorities of the country on social and Labor problems. He is at the head of the Chicago School of Civics and Philanthropy and is a member of the Chicago Commons, an organization of the most noted sociological workers and authorities of the Windy ('ity. He is the associate editor of the Social Survey, the greatest paper devoted to sociological work and research in the country.

The government recently in a notable way recognized the high position he holds among authorities on labor and social problems, when it called him to investigate conditions after the Cherry mine disaster.

The Men and Religion Forward Movement is designed to interest men and boys in the work of the churches and it aims especially to bring their attention to lines of work in their local communities which need the united effort of the men in the attempt to better conditions. This is part of a nation-wide movement. The local campaign opens Tuesday night with a banquet at the Auditorium, where W. J. Bryan will preside and deliver an address
