Eleven men have so far registered to attend the state Y. M. C. A. conference meeting at Crete April 12-14.

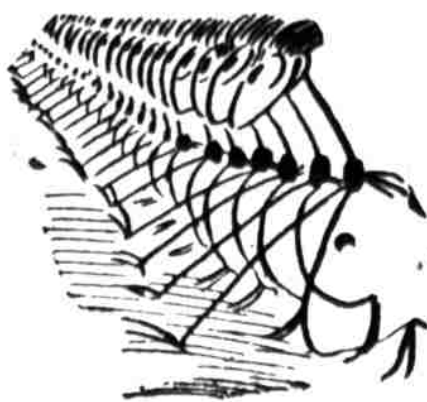
Capt. E. E. Thrapp of Co. H rejoined his company after an absence of a month caused by an attack of tonsillitis.
