Financially the track season has always been a losing proposition at the University of Nebraska. Its deficit has generally been sufficient to eat up a large part of the profits made during football season.

To this lamentable condition several causes can be ascribed; the immense expense incurred in sending large track teams on long trips, the former lack of a suitable athletic field, and last, but not least, lack of support.

There is one cause, however, which exists at one time or another in nearly every college or university, which cannot be justly considered at Nebraska—that of a poor team. Since time immemorial the Cornhusker track team has been noted for its ability, and better yet for its wonderful spirit. True, it has not always won the valley championship, nor has it distinguished itself for star performances, but it has always been able to account for itself. It is invariably feared in the valley, it has beaten Minnesota every time with the exception of last year, thus wiping out the sting of innumerable football defeats. It has established records which are in a fair way to stand. All this it has done not by drawing into its fold stars from other schools, but by developing them at home; not by relying upon star performers, but rather upon its indomitable spirit. Nebraska has a reputation in the valley for being a good loser, a modest winner.

The cause of the financial difficulty, then, is plainly not in the team itself, but in the support. We did not win the meet at Drake, but no one will deny that hard luck got the better of us in the very event which we were calculated to win.

The dual meet with Ames Saturday (Ames we should have beaten last fall) will offer an excellent opportunity to begin the remedying of the evil. 'Nuf sed.

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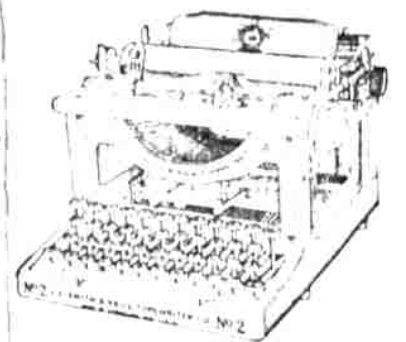
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
