FRESHMEN TO ENTER MEET.

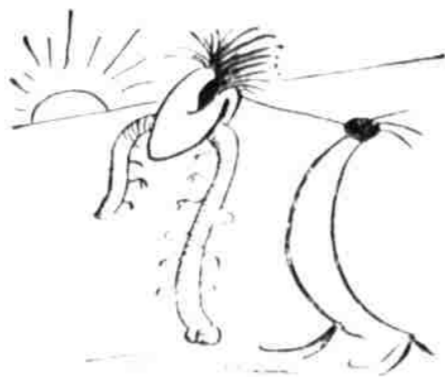
Four Athletes Will Compete at Omaha as Unattached Amateurs.
