

## MOOT COURT STARTS

PRACTICE COURT FOR LAWS ORGANIZED BY DEAN HASTINGS.

### OFFICERS FOR SEMESTER NAMED

Cases Assigned to Students and Work Begins at Once—Looking Forward to New Building on Campus.

Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock the practice court work in the College of Law was begun by Dean W. G. Hastings, who announced some of the plans for the year.

Dean Hastings said: "As far back as the time of Plato—and I do not know how far back of his time the idea existed—it was said that we get the most out of dealing with realities." In the practice work the Nebraska code will be followed because it will be more real and because it is not materially different from other codes. The issues will be somewhat narrowed.

#### Remuneration for Officers.

Mr. Scheffelbein was appointed clerk of the district and supreme courts; Mr. Baskins was appointed sheriff. Each of these men can choose a deputy. Remuneration will be given the officers of the courts for their services. The two justices of the peace were not named at the meeting. Mr. Foster and Mr. Ledwith will sit as nisi prius judges, Mr. Hastings as county judge, and Mr. Robbins will have charge of the organization of the supreme court, which will be announced later.

At the meeting several cases were given out to the students, and work will start upon these at once. Nearly all of the partnerships were announced. While the quarters for court work are not adequate at present, the laws are all looking forward to their new building, where complete equipment will be provided.

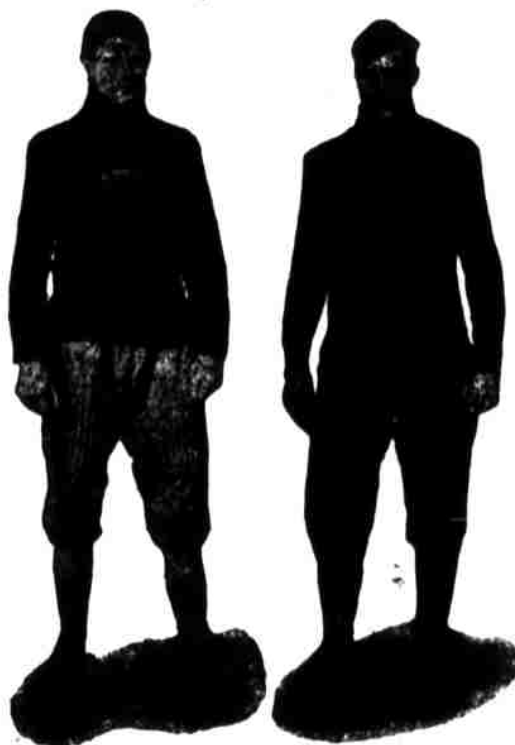
