## NO CO-EDS AT AMES

MUST MAKE WAY FOR ENGINEERS FROM IOWA CITY

RADICAL STEP BY IOWA BOARD

All Engineering to Be Given at Ames Hereafter-Arts. Sclences and Domestic Science at lowa CityA New Ruling.

The State Board of Education of Iowa has takin a very important step, an action which is the most far-reach ing of any ever taken by any similar governing body of this country. This action is the coordination of the thres state institutions of learning, viz, the State University at lowa City, the Iowa state College of Agriculture, and Mechanic Arts at Ames, and the Stat Teachers' College at Cedar Falls,
Heretofore the courses given in these rempective institutions have overlapped Domestic science and science has been given at both lowa and Ames; engi neering has been given at both thes Institutions: a course in liberal arte has been offered at lowa and Cedar Falls. This overlapping of courses has caused much trouble in the past, as concentration on certain courses has been impossible owing to the fact that the equipment and facilities have been divided Three large state institutions giving work of a similar nature, but of course differing in some respects, wert within a radius of 125 miles. It was natural that the same departments in the different schools would not be equally good. The Engineering School at Ames was superior to Iowa, the domestic sclence course at lowa was bet ter than that of Ames, and the liberal arts course at lowa excelled that o Cedar Falls. The question then was, Why not combine the courses and thus reduce duplication as between
The board has finally agreed upon the following plan of co-ordination of the three Institutions: First, all work in engineering is to be centered at the Agriculturalcollege; second, all courses in professional education and liberal arts at the Teachers' College, which extend beyond the sophomore year will be discontinued and centered at the Iniversity: third, all courses in general science and domestic sclence now existing at the Celloge of Agriculture will be discontinued and the field of household art will be opened at the University
Such a radical step on the part of the Board of Education will place Iowa In the front rank of the leading edu cational institutions of the countiy.
