**Kreymer Gives Recital.**

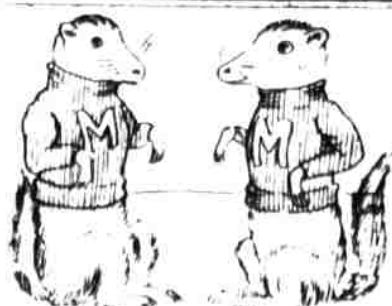
