WHO BREAKS THE TIE?

Tomorrow's game with Kansas represents the seventh played since the two schools resumed athletic relations in 1906. During that time the two teams have broken even on the number of games lost and won. In 1906 the game was played here and Kansas won by the score of 8 to 6.

In the following year the Cornhuskers journeyed to Lawrence and defeated the Jayhawkers by the score of 16 to 6. The next two games were played at Lincoln and resulted in victories for Kansas. The game played in 1908 was a decisive victory for Kansas, while the game of 1909 was won by Tommy Johnson, who in the last few minutes of play, getting a Nebraska fumble, and with splendid interference, broke through the entire Nebraska team for a 90-yard run, and scored a touchdown.

In 1910 and 1911 the Cornhuskers traveled to Lawrence and came home the victor each time. The first game was a close one, Nebraska winning, 6 to 0, while the latter resulted in the uneven score of 29 to 0.

What will be the result this year? Every time the two teams have met the visiting eleven has won the vic-

tory. Will the precedent hold, or will it turn. We think the latter. Nebraska has not played sensational ball this season, but it has played good football. Kansas has suffered a series of dire defeats, and by following the analogy to its national concession it would seem that the odds were in favor of our own team.
