### EXTRA DRILL FOR DELINQUENTS

Friday Night Appointed for "Cuts" to Make Up for Absence-Disobedience Also Provided For.

Absolute discipline is to be the rule in the military department hereafter. according to the new order which the commandant announced in a lecture last night at the drill hour. Absences which are not caused by sickness or are granted by the deans will call for the regular five demerits, but will also mean that the cadet shoulders his gun for two extra hours to make up the loss of time. If excused for any other than the above mentioned reasons no Dodge foundation, a sum of money left demerits will be given, but the extradrill will not be dispensed with. One hour will be considered sufficient to make up the delinquency.

Disobedience to officers, commissioned and non-commissioned, will call for more severe punishments than formerly. Spoiling equipment and not appearing in a uniform in good shape will mean that the cadet drills from one-half to two extra hours.

After Meeting of Council of American Historical Association Lectures at Yale on the French Revolution.

Dr F M Fling left Lincoln last Wednesday with the vacation-seeking throng of students, going east to a J. R. Wood, I. K. #### Roosevelt Presides.

Dr. Fling is one of the six men elected to the council from the country at large, and this is his second year's service. The council is the executive board of the association, composed of the president, vice-president, ex-presidents, and the six elected members. Ex-President Roosevelt presides over the meetings of the association and the council this year.

The council convened in New York Friday of last week, and Friday evening was tendered a banquet at the ★★★★★ Metropolitan Club by Mr. Roosevelt, as president of the council. On Saturday the council went into an all-day business session, mapping out lines of effort for the association meeting later

Lectures at Yale.

Sunday Dr. Fling went on to New Haven, where he will spend three weeks as a lecturer in the department of history of Yale. He will conduct the graduate seminar on the French Revolution, putting into practice the principles of his system of instruction. He also gives lectures on the French Revolution, speaking before the Graduate Club and illustrating the methods of historical research and source work which he uses at this school and by which he has built up the department
