

MAST SPEAKS TO FORESTERS

Colorado Expert Talks About Reformation—Has Made Study of Nebraska Conditions.

A special series of lectures is being given for the forestry students by W. H. Mast of the Gunnison National forest of Colorado. The lectures were begun Tuesday and will be continued until Saturday. All of the talks are about planting or reforestation. Anybody interested is welcome.

Mr. Mast has been in the Forest Service for twelve years and has made a special study of reforestation. For seven years previous to his transfer to Colorado he was stationed at the Halsey National Forest where he made a careful study of the prospects of the Nebraska forest.

COMMENCEMENT CHANGED

Charter Day Falling on Saturday, Causes a Change in Dates.

Because of the fact that February 15, Charter Day, falls on Saturday this year, the usual date for the mid-year commencement is to be changed. Friday, the 14th, is to be recognized as Charter Day and the commencement exercises will be held that evening. About twenty-five will receive degrees at that time. Nothing definite has as yet been decided as to the speaker for the evening, nor have plans been made for the reception, which customarily follows the exercise.

The annual Sigma Xi address is always given the evening before the mid-winter commencement. It will come on Thursday evening this year.

Professor Cassius J. Kelper, Ph. D., Adrian professor of mathematics in Columbia university, will deliver the address, "Concerning the Figure and Dimensions of the Universe of Space."
