WHERE WE STAND ON COMPLIMENTARY TICKETS.

In their apparent zeal to comply with the growing sentiment for greater economy in the management of University functions, various managements by sundry and diverse indirection have sought to deprive the Nebraskan of its customary right to free tickets. In a general way, we concur with the fundamental principle that underlies such trickery. We believe that since the Student Publication Board has decided to pay the editorial staff of the Nebraskans, it should compel the "Rag" to report all University events without any additional compensation. There is no denying that the practice of receiving complimentary tickets, secretly as that practice is indulged, may easily become the instrument for wholesale corruption and graft. Furthermore, a general and effective program of economy requires that the official and student branches of the University know where every cent the Nebraskan earns comes from. We favor the official denial by the Student Publication Board of the right of the Nebraskan to receive complimentary tickets.

Independently of such action by the Board, the Nebraskan does not expect to part with its prescriptive rights. It never was a part of our original design to qualify our effectiveness by reducing our conceded emoluments. That this is more than a declaration of theory and principle is shown by the fact that too much of the Nebraskan's work has been done for too long a time in strict reliance on the free tickets.

This fact alone should convince all who seek publicity that philanthropy is not a necessary part of agitation, nor must charity necessarily precede an emotional appeal. At the time of taking up our duties we were fully cognizant of all our written and written rights, and subsequent discussion of what those rights are is indulged only for the purpose of showing

that they have throughout this semester remained substantially the same as they have been for the last ten years. We have by long years of established precedent acquired a prescriptive right to free admittance into all University events reported, and until the University abrogates such privileges, as we believe it should, we refuse to compromise our efficiency by diminishing the entirety of our reward.
