a news story to come in without its appropriate number of free passes is simply to deprive seven individuals with various ethical standards and notions of their opportunity to dispose of the space for the compensation they are used to. Neither is he expected to conclude that the average editor, having refused to collect his own free tickets, will less diligently collect the free tickets of his associates. Nor is he expected to conclude that collaborers at the task of discharging editorial responsibility to you will be less faithfur to their work. when independently of any scruples of ours or anybody's, they are deprived of an established emolument.

In short, the extrinsic observer is not expected to conclude that a policy of personal martyrdom merely specializes, limits to fewer numbers, the chance to graft, and that the evil of pass boughten stories is not the fault of the man but the fault of the eye-

The object of drastically preventing the various indepedent employees of the "Rag" from secretly receiving as many comps as they can possibly get, is to see to it that through the columns of the only publicity agent on the campus, every activity, big and small, rich and poor, gets a square deal. The fundamental fact with reference to this object, repeatedly overlooked by the shallow "knocker," is that it makes no differences whether we or others of the seven sell out the "Rag" so long as the "Rag" is actually sold out. If is uscless for one man to abandon that suspicious reward unless the whole force abandons that potentially pernicious privilege. With this fact in view, the man who thinks will see that the object of our movement against interest is not to give our souls the benefit of a purging emo-'ion. If it was, we would refuse a comp to the law barbecue. Our object in waging this last battle for the tight but honest is simply to prevent everyhody from selling out University events. And to those most familiar with the way the Nebraskan is run it must seem perfectly clear that the only way to prevent a virtual sale of the University for an editor's stipend is to officially prevent the issuance and receipt of newspaper
