To our refusal to publish without free tickets the announcement of the law barbecue committee, the members of that committee have publicly replied. Their laconic rejoinder contains but three sentences. The first sentence states that for the publication of announcements we demanded ten comps. As a matter of fact we demanded only three.

Their second sentence states that we are looking grim because of our disappointment and chagrin at not receiving favors. Careful analysis of their caustic reply shows its consistency to be about as follows: The first sentence is false. Their second sentence is wind. And their last sentence is ignorance. No one is therefore required to adopt as his own the conclusions of that committee in that article.

They have neither tone nor beauty. They are the offspring of the mind of a moral non-entity, and are about as near being a real dance as the quintessence

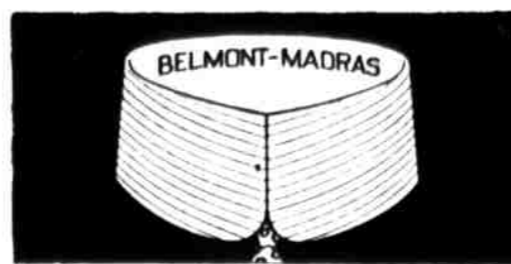
