

Kearney M. A. Wins in High School Meet-- Pawnee Second

With a total of 36½ points the Kearney Military Academy carried off the state track and field meet held last Saturday on the Nebraska field. The meet was fast and exciting, all of the events being bitterly contested.

State records were broken in the pole vault, mile run, and the broad jump. The first record to be broken was in the mile run which was lowered by Graf of Tecumseh. At the crack of the pistol Graf took the lead and was never passed but increased his lead over his competitors until at the finish he was about twenty yards in the rear of Wallace who took second. Graf lowered the record of 4 minutes and 44 seconds to 4 minutes and 43.23 seconds.

The record held by Wiley in the broad jump was also broken. L. Liebendorfer of Pawnee City jumped 21 feet, 2½ inches beating the former state record by five inches.

Probably the most exciting event of the afternoon was the pole vault in which Frank Reavis of Falls City broke his own state record of 11 feet 6 inches and added one more inch to the height. After easily clearing the bar at 11 feet 7 inches Reavis placed the bar at 12 feet in the hopes of making a record that would stand for some time but after three nearly successful attempts was compelled to give up. In practice Reavis has vaulted 12 feet 2 inches. He is planning to participate in the interscholastic meet to be held at Chicago in the hopes of establishing a world's record which now stands at 12 feet ½ inches for high school vaulting.
