Dr. P. L. Hall Gives Address to Students On "Banking Reform"

Dr. P. L. Hall, president of the Central National Bank of this city, addressed the members of Professor Le Rossignol's class in money and banking yesterday morning. He spoke on the "Recent Proposals for Banking Reform," reviewing the dicerent bills which Congress will soon be called upon to consider in connection with changes of our currency system.

"All of these proposals," said Dr Hall, "involves the establishment of a credit currency based on assets, which would be less secure than our present national bank notes based on government bonds. What we need most of all is the strengthening of commercial credit so that commercial paper may become absolutely secure.

A government auditing department might accomplish this result."

Dr. Hall is a forceful and convincing speaker, and his talk aroused much interest and discussion among the students of this branch of political economy.
