**FRESHMEN SHOULD NOW
FLOCK TO THE LIBRARY**

**Librarian Wyer Has Instructed All
First-Year Students in Use and
Resources of Library.**

After this year no freshman will have an excuse for not knowing how to make use of the library facilities at hand, for Mr. Wyer, the new librarian, has instituted a course in library instruction which will reach all freshman students. All first-year rhetoric students, and therefore all freshmen, following the plan begun this fall, will be taken through the library and will have the system and cataloging methods explained to them. This, it is believed, will bring about a much more general use of the library for actual study purposes.

Yesterday morning was largely spent by the rhetoric classes in taking this first lesson in library science. Mr. Wyer personally conducted the students through the stack rooms and showed them the reference material at hand.

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til twelve (12) o'clock noon of Monday of the third week.

(c) No fraternity shall pledge a new student who is registered for less than twelve (12) college hours, and who can not present the minimum number of entrance points required by the University.

ARTICLE III.

No student shall be pledged or initiated without the approval of the president of the council, to whom the name of each prospective member shall be submitted at least one school day in advance.

ARTICLE IV.

(a) The pledge of any man who fails to make twelve (12) hours during either semester of his freshman year shall be automatically removed, provided, however, that he be given six (6) weeks in which to remove "conditions" and "incompletes" and thus bring his record up to the required twelve (12) hours.

(b) No man whose pledge has been removed shall be eligible to be rushed, pledged, or tacitly pledged by any fraternity until he has made twelve hours in addition to those he shall already have made at the time his pledge was removed.

ARTICLE XII.

The school year of 1913-1914 shall be the last year of freshman pledging and initiating.
